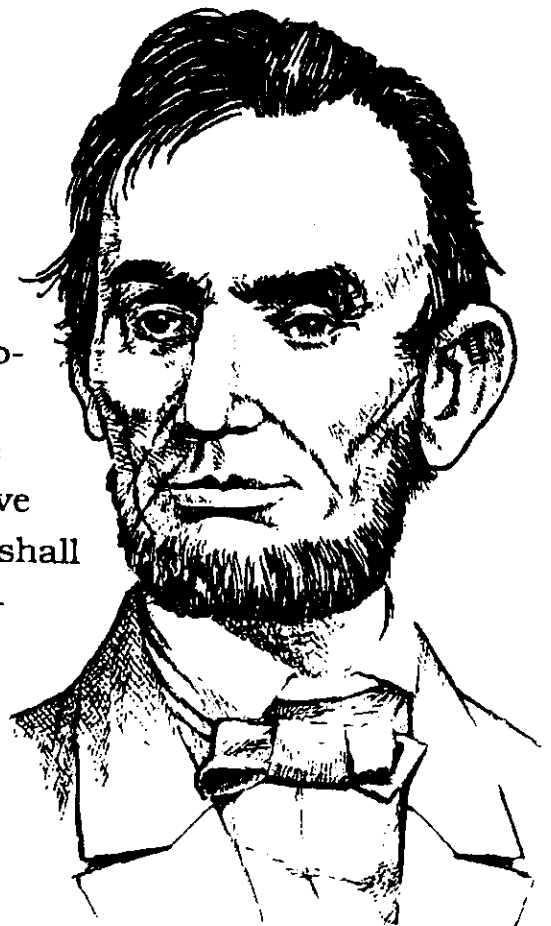

The Gettysburg Address

Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent a new nation, conceived in liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal.

Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battlefield of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this.

But in a larger sense, we can not dedicate—we can not consecrate—we can not hallow—this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us—that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion—that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain—that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom—and that government of the people, by the people, and for the people, shall not perish from the earth.

- Amendment 11 (1798)** Keeps any one of the states from being sued by citizens of another state or of a foreign country.

- Amendment 14 (1868)** Forbids laws that unfairly deny citizen's rights and guarantees equal protection under the law to all.
- Amendment 15 (1870)** Forbids depriving citizens of the right to vote because of their race or color.
- Amendment 16 (1913)** Authorizes an income tax.
- Amendment 17 (1913)** Calls for senators to be elected by direct vote of the people.
- Amendment 18 (1919)** The Prohibition Amendment. Forbids the manufacture or sale of liquor.
- Amendment 19 (1920)** Grants women the right to vote.
- Amendment 20 (1933)** Starts presidential and congressional terms in January.
- Amendment 21 (1933)** Repeals the Eighteenth Amendment.
- Amendment 22 (1951)** Bars any President from serving more than two terms (8 years).
- Amendment 23 (1961)** Gives residents of the District of Columbia (Washington, D.C.) the right to vote for President.
- Amendment 24 (1964)** Outlaws the payment of taxes as a voting requirement.
- Amendment 25 (1967)** Sets rules for succession if a President cannot complete the term.
- Amendment 26 (1971)** Lowers the legal voting age to eighteen.
- Amendment 27 (1992)** Makes any Congressional pay raise effective after the following election of Representatives.

Constitution Connection

☆December 15, 1791☆

Preamble

We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

Bill of Rights

Amendment 1 Congress cannot establish an official religion. It cannot pass laws that limit religious worship, freedom of speech, freedom of the press, the right to gather peacefully, and the right to contact the government for help from unfair practices.

Amendment 2 The federal government cannot limit the rights of states and individuals to own weapons.

Amendment 3 People cannot be forced to house soldiers in their home.

Amendment 4 People cannot be arrested nor can their house or belongings be searched without probable cause or a proper warrant.

Amendment 5 No one has to stand trial for a federal crime unless formally charged by a grand jury. A person cannot be tried for the same crime twice nor can he be forced to testify against himself. No one can be deprived of life, freedom or property without due process of law. The government cannot take a person's property for public use without paying him fairly.

Amendment 6 A person accused of a crime has the right to a quick, fair and public trial by an impartial jury.

Amendment 7 A person involved in a federal court civil suit where the value of the item being argued is more than \$20 has the right to a trial by jury.

Amendment 8 The amount set for bails and fines must be fair. Cruel and unusual punishment is prohibited.

Amendment 9 The listing of specific rights in the Constitution does not mean that rights not listed are forfeited by the people.

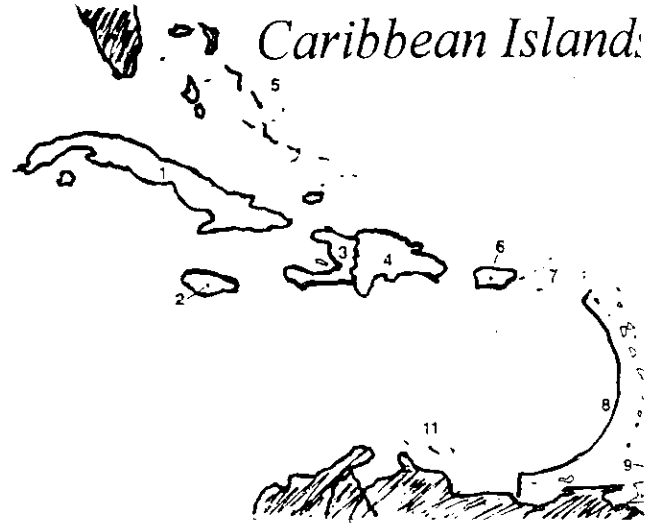
Amendment 10 Powers not given to the federal government by the Constitution are reserved for the states or for individuals.
